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Thank you for the opportunity to play a small role in what God is going to do through you and your friends. Our role at CRI is to provide resources that will help you influence others toward a relationship with Jesus Christ.

We have a VISION that every student in your school should have the opportunity to say "YES" to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ...at school. Sharing the gospel at school is important!

If this is the first time you have connected with FiSH, we hope that you find it has simple and effective as it is designed to be. FiSH is a tool, a plan. At the end of this manual you should find a group of Christian teenagers who create successful outreach environments during non-curriculum times at school. These clubs will meet once each week for 20-30 minutes.

If you have used FiSH in the past, we have tried to simplify this manual. Please let us know what you think. Your input is always helpful.

If you DO NOT have a student-led Christian club at your school, our Team Building Guide can help you start one. If you DO have a student-led Christian club at your school you can implement the FiSH strategy in those club meetings without changing the name of your club.

In Luke 5, Jesus told Simon Peter after a really cool miracle, "Don't be afraid, Peter! Walk with me and you will catch people." Simon Peter did...and what he experienced changed his life, the lives of thousands then...and millions since. Imagine Jesus saying to you...don't freak out, there is nothing to be afraid of...walk with me...and you WILL catch people. It will change your life and others.

This manual contains a simple process, FiSH, that your Bible club will repeat every four weeks. FiSH will help you apply what you learn in church, pray for a friend, encourage other Christians and influence your friends toward a personal relationship with God.

Read this manual. It's simple. Hopefully, as you read, God will clarify and expand the vision He has for your ministry in your school.

Getting Started...What is FiSH?

FiSH is a focused outreach plan that enables local churches to help students create an environment to share the gospel with friends at school. As this strategy takes form, Christian students will initiate and lead a Christian club at their school if they do not already have one. If a Christian club already exists, FiSH may be implemented through that organization. These student-led clubs operate under the guidelines of the Equal Access Act. This effort is focused on outreach, with a plan to incorporate students who are reached at school into local churches...your local church. Each club should reflect the personality and giftedness of the students who lead club meetings and the youth worker who guides them.

FiSH is a plan; a process, a system, and a framework that will help you start something in your school that God could use to make a huge difference. It's time to make a difference in your school! God's ready, how about you? Just follow the steps...it's easy.

Student Leaders will...
Plan and implement the Fishing Cycle.
Lead in the Follow-up process.
Report Fish Stories & Net Results monthly.

Youth Workers Only

Aahhh, yes! The life of a youth worker...full-time, part-time, volunteer...any way you slice it you come up BUSY...way too busy. It's easy to become so overwhelmed that we become convinced that making a difference at the school down the street is better left to someone else.

This is YOUR big opportunity! You have a VERY important role. Whether you are a parent, college student, "professional" youth pastor, or even a grandparent, FiSH can help you fulfill your ministry goals and make your life easier at the same time. How? By turning your students into ministers!

Each club will need a Campus Guide. A Campus Guide is a youth worker, parent, grandparent, college student or other concerned adult.

Campus Guides will...
Attend club meetings at the request of the students.
Meet with Student Leaders, as necessary, to plan club meetings.
Provide consistent encouragement and club forms when necessary.

Who and what is Campus Revolution?

We are Campus Revolution, Inc. (CRI) and we exist to assist local churches establish, resource, and maintain a multi-denominational, student-led outreach strategy in secondary schools. CRI is a 501c3 non-profit organization that is accountable to a board of directors as well as a group of denominational youth ministry leaders. A 501c3 organization is charitable and capable of receiving contributions that are tax deductible by the donor.

CRI empowers students and youth workers with a strategy to help a Bible club make an outreach oriented impact in a school, a Christian presence with a purpose...outreach. Clubs start everyday, but many fail to




influence students because of lack of guidance, direction, stability, and a well-defined course to follow... a map. FiSH provides the map.

Is this a Bible Study?

No. We dig the Bible. We read and study it everyday. You should too! However, the focus of the FiSH strategy is giving your friends a chance to say "YES" to Jesus and encouraging the other believers at your school. Think of FiSH as a Great Commission oriented club plan.

Why a DEAD FISH?



The dead fish in our FiSH logo represents people who are "dead" in sin, floating through life without a relationship with Jesus Christ. The cross in the eye represents hope for new life because of the sacrifice Jesus made for us when He was crucified on a cross to pay the penalty for our sin. The reason the cross is in the eye is because until we see others the way Jesus did we will never be motivated into action. Pretty cool, huh?

Lake, River, Stream or Sea...

Because the strategy is a framework, it is effective in urban, suburban, or rural communities. It will work in your community, as well. The following are the five basic elements that are involved in supporting this strategy.

A **FISH** is a student swimming through life without a relationship with Jesus Christ, spiritually dead.

A **FISHERMAN** is a Christian student surrounded by lost friends who are spiritually dead.

A **FISHING LICENSE** is the Equal Access Act, which provides students the freedom and opportunity to initiate and lead a Christian club at school. For information on the Equal Access Act, visit www.campusrevolution.net.

A **GUIDE** is an adult, pastor, youth pastor, parent, college student, grandparent, etc, who helps students to successfully implement the Fishing Cycle. A Campus Guide should be committed to this role. Students need your support. If a person is unable to fulfill this responsibility, they should notify the Student Leaders so a replacement can be found.

The students have all the rights and all the influence. The Guide's job is to provide support and guidance the Student Leaders need. A Guide will seldom fish. Rather, they do whatever is necessary to make sure the trip is successful for the fishermen...Christian students.

This is REALLY IMPORTANT...the Guide must meet with the Student Leaders at least once a month to plan the Fishing Cycle. The best time for this meeting is typically between Hook and Focus...we'll explain later.

A **BOAT** represents a local church that is full of eager adults who are ready to provide a supportive and stabilizing force, through prayer, for the fishermen...students. Adults are asking, "What can we do to help"? Here's a novel idea, PRAY!



The BIG "3" THREE

PRAYER

Nothing great happens apart from prayer. We get a burden for what we pray for and a burden moves us to a passionate response. With this in mind, it makes sense to get people to pray that God would use you.

Pray for a friend! God has given you influence with someone. It may be only one or two other students or 436...pray for them...specifically...by name. Remember, talk to God about your friends and you'll be more likely to talk to your friends about God. Pray for an opportunity to invest in, influences, and invite a friend to hear the message of the gospel. If you are not willing to pray for your friends...do not expect to see God move mightily at your school.

PASSION

Passion is a byproduct of a vision obtained through prayer. Prayer and passion go hand in hand. Jesus SAW the crowds...and had compassion for them! When we see what God sees WE WILL HAVE COMPASSION for them, too! God-centered prayer is connected to God-given passion, which ultimately leads us to influence others toward a relationship with Jesus Christ. We see others the way God sees them...when we pray!

PLAN

The Fishing Cycle is a four-week cycle that guides students through four distinct club meetings. We call it a cycle because it repeats every four weeks. Club meetings occur once a week. The success of the Fishing Cycle is a by-product of outreach-oriented relationships.

The Fishing Cycle club meetings are Focus (small group accountability), Inspiration (a guest speaker), Share (student-led testimonies), and Hook (a short but clear gospel presentation).

Club Leadership

FiSH works best with a leadership structure that is based on teams that are responsible for one week of the Fishing Cycle so that the responsibility is spread among the students. Each team is responsible for one week of the strategy. There are five leadership teams: Focus Team, Inspiration Team, Share Team, Hook Team and Follow-up Team. If you are starting with only a few students, divide responsibility among the group until more students become involved.

The leadership team for each meeting of the cycle may choose to have a Team Captain. It is the responsibility of that student to recruit his or her team before the first club meeting or as the club grows. The size of a team can vary from one to five. The Follow-up Team may have more, if necessary.

The Campus Guide should meet with the Student Leaders and/or Team Captains at least every four weeks to make sure the bases are covered for upcoming club meetings. The best time to meet is between Hook and Focus. Doing this allows a club to always have at least four club meetings planned and allows the Guide to affirm the importance of follow-up.



You may also choose to use insert a special club planning meeting between each Hook and Focus meeting. In this case the whole club can participate in the planning. If you choose to have a club meeting to plan the following Fishing Cycle, use that time to pray, plan and encourage new believers.

The First Club Meeting...should be a vision casting session to introduce the Fishing Cycle to the other Christian students in the school.

Use this club meeting to recruit additional students to be involved in leadership, if necessary. A special "First Club Meeting" document is downloadable from www.campusrevolution.net. This document can be downloaded and read verbatim during the first club meeting. It covers every aspect of the Fishing Cycle. Even if it is not read during the club meeting, you should have it available as a reference. Your second meeting will be the first meeting of the Fishing Cycle...Focus.

FOCUS MEETING

This is the first meeting of the Fishing Cycle. A small group environment in which you FOCUS on what God is doing in your life through your local church, personal time alone with God and a friend for whom you are praying.

Every Christian should develop the discipline of accountability. If we are not responsible for the principles we learn in church and how we live, we are subject to our own ways and decisions. Be a real, authentic, genuine Christian. A Focus Group will help you do that.

Pick your own Focus Group. Each Focus Group should try to have three to four students, including the Focus Group Leader. Clearly, Focus Group information will change throughout the year.

Make a Focus Group Card like this to pass out to Focus Group Leaders. Complete this card with the name, phone number and e-mail address of the students in your focus group. Return it to your Campus Guide next week or someone from the Focus Team.

**During each Focus meeting you will discuss:

Focus Guides (see Appendix B) should be available at each club meeting so make plenty of copies. Focus Groups should meet weekly, outside of club meetings at a time that is convenient for the group, in addition to the Focus club meeting. Having Focus Guides available weekly encourages this.

Focus Points

**RENEWING THE MIND
The only way to change our actions is to change our mind.
The only way to change our mind is to Fill it with God's words.**

Romans 12:2 says...don't copy the behavior and customs of the world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think...RENEWING YOUR MIND. Then you will know what God wants you to do, and you will know how good and pleasing and perfect His will really is.

Here are a few great passages you may want to memorize. It may seem like a lot, however consistent application throughout each week of each month of each year will make it very simple.

**APPLYING BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES
Participating in a Focus Group will help you pay attention in church.**

An Action Point is a biblical principle learned at church or through personal devotion time that is applied to our daily life. Use the Focus Guide, Appendix B.

**PRAYING FOR A FRIEND
We don't talk to our Friends about God,
because we don't talk to God about our Friends.**

By telling another Christian the name of the person you are praying for, you become responsible to pray for and be ready to extend an invitation to that friend when God provides the OPPORTUNITY. Encourage one another to look for opportunities to influence your friend toward Christ.

FiSH Prayer Card

If you have not seen the FiSH Prayer Card, check it out at www.campusrevolution.net. The FiSH Prayer Card is a



reminder to pray for a specific non-Christian friend. As you place this sticker of a fish on something you see everyday, you will be reminded that if you are following, you will be fishing. Purchasing a FiSH Prayer Card is not a requirement for implementing FiSH. It's just a great way to help you pray for your friends.

**The B.A.I.T. acronym helps us focus on how we can be used by God.
 Believe that God wants to do something in the life of your friend.
 Accept the responsibility to allow God to use you in that person's life.
 Invest and invite that friend to an environment in which the gospel
 will be clearly presented.
 Thank God for what He is going to do.**

When students come to the Focus meeting who are not part of an existing Focus Group encourage them to meet in a group with someone they know.

Keep a box of club resources in the Faculty Volunteer's room so you don't have to worry about leaving the material at home, i.e. Focus Guides, Response Cards, etc.

INSPIRATION MEETING

This is the second meeting of the Fishing Cycle. The Fishing Cycle is designed to have one quality inspirational speaker every four weeks. The speakers could include ministers, athletes, parents, business people, school faculty, etc.

The speaker should not discuss denominational issues. Communicating this important message to the guest speaker is the responsibility of the Campus Guide and a Student Leader of the Inspiration Team.

Make sure the guest speaker has a host from the Inspiration Team that will get them to the meeting room and send a thank you card to the speaker once the meeting is over. The host should call the guest speaker the day before the club meeting, as a reminder to ask them if they intend to share the gospel. If the speaker intends to share the gospel, leave five minutes at the end of the club meeting to complete Response Cards.

SHARE MEETING

This is the third meeting of the Fishing Cycle. When we understand that our testimony is more about what God has done than our own mistakes and poor decisions we will recognize that...every believer has a valuable story.

This meeting intends to help students recognize the significance of their personal testimony and learn to tell it well.

Each student should complete a Testimony Guide, Appendix H, before speaking during a club meeting. The Guide and Share Student Leaders should approve each testimony. The Testimony Guide serves three purposes:



1. To help the student outline their thoughts and what they want to communicate.
2. To help the student stay focused on what they intend to communicate.
3. To let the Campus Guide and Leadership Team know what will be communicated.

The Testimony Guide brings clarity to what the student wants to communicate and gives them confidence. A copy of the Testimony Guide should be returned to the student so they can follow it during the testimony time. This also helps the student know when to end. The Testimony Guide is designed to help the student communicate effectively. The Campus Guide and Student Leaders determine who and how many students share during the club meeting.

Pray

When the testimonies are completed, encourage the students to pray for the friend they will invite to the Hook Meeting the next week. The prayer should include a petition that God would give them an opportunity to invite their friend to the Hook meeting the next week and thanksgiving for what God is going to do. Students can gather into Focus Groups and pray out loud for their friends.

HOOK MEETING

This is the fourth meeting of the Fishing Cycle. This meeting is an opportunity for Christian students to bring their non-Christian friends to a non-threatening environment, to hear a clear presentation of the gospel and have an opportunity to respond in faith.

Hook Week never changes..ALWAYS share the gospel!

Even if you think everyone there a Christian, make a clear presentation of the gospel every time, no exceptions. A Christian student should share the gospel message. Even if the student stands and reads the gospel presentation in Appendix K, it is not how they shared; it is what they shared that is powerful.

No opening prayer. No worship. Just eating and hanging out until time for the gospel presentation. Why? Because you don't want to do anything that would cause a non-believer to disconnect because they feel left out, uninformed or different. If this is seems unusual, remember...this meeting is for those who have not yet placed their faith in Jesus Christ.

Make sure the music comes from a stereo during the music, food, and hanging out time. The mixer type atmosphere disarms people and establishes a casual atmosphere, which makes effective communication possible. Promoting the Hook meeting is based on relationships. If every participating student is committed to bringing one friend to this club meeting, there will be plenty of students to share the gospel with.

Leave time for EVERYONE to Fill out a Response Card at the end of the club meeting! This helps make guests not feel singled out and provides a record of who attended that day.



Closing Prayer

The student who dismisses the club in prayer should thank God for those who just committed their lives to Jesus Christ. The prayer could be something as simple as "God thank you for those you have just invited you into their lives and have become part of your family. We know that all of heaven is celebrating because of their salvation." Applaud as soon as the prayer ends...celebrating what God has done. This sends a message to those who have just committed their lives to Jesus Christ and that what they have done is very important.

When a student prays and commits their life to Christ, they may be contemplating whether to fill out the Response Card and turn it in. The prayer and applause will affirm the value of their decision and encourage them. If heaven gets excited about people coming to know Jesus, then we should too!

FOLLOW-UP Getting the Fish in a boat...your local church

**Everyone enjoys catching Fish, but few enjoy cleaning them.
It's messy, it takes time, but cleaning fish is part of fishing.
We must avoid the "catch and release" mindset at all cost.**

What will get the attention of your pastor and congregation is when new believers start coming to church, getting baptized, getting involved. It is our responsibility to make sure each new believer is connected with and plugged into a local church where they can grow in their new faith. If a student commits their life to Christ at school and is not followed up with, we have done a disservice to them and the work of Christ.

**The Follow-up process is defined using the acronym, R.E.E.L.
Reach a classmate by investing and inviting that person to Hook Week.
Encourage the new believer to become involved in your church and Focus Group.
Equip the new believer to share their story and have personal devotions.
Lead the new believer as you seek to reach additional friends.**

The Three Step Follow-Up Process

Step ONE: Collect Response Cards and sort them into three categories:

- A - I committed my life to Christ today.
- B - I would like to talk with someone about this decision.
- C - I have already committed my life to Christ.

Step TWO: Complete a Follow-Up Guide, Appendix A

A completed Follow-Up Guide should be given to the student who brought the new believer to the club meeting. It is the responsibility of that Christian student to nurture the new Christian using the steps in the Follow-Up Guide.



Step THREE: Distribute Response Cards

The original Response Card, Appendix J, should be given to the Campus Guide. The Campus Guide should make sure that the church indicated on the Response Card is notified, if applicable.

Complete FiSH Stories & Net Results Chart: Appendix I.

Net Results are the number of students that gave their lives to Christ as the Fishing Cycle is being implemented. FiSH Stories are stories of students who committed their life to Christ or stories of students that were being prayed for that have come to faith in Christ. A student on the Follow-Up Team needs to report the club's "catch" in FiSH Stories & Net Results at www.campusrevolution.net so others around the country can celebrate. 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Gospel Presentation

Welcome to (your club name). My name is (your name) I want to take a few minutes tell you about the most important decision I have ever made.

God does exist and he has a special plan for each of our lives. That special plan begins with getting to know him personally. We were born with our backs turned toward God. To make things worse we repeatedly choose to run our lives as if God doesn't exist. This decision to reject God deserves death. When we place our faith in what Jesus Christ did for us by taking our punishment God. Ezekiel 14:6, Jeremiah 25:5, Acts 26:20, 1 Peter 3:11

H – Honor God. God is honored when we walk with Him, follow His path, and recognize the wisdom that He extends to us. Essentially, God is honored when our lifestyle, our actions, our ambitions, and our attitudes reflect His moral code and His love for all people. Philippians 1:27, Colossians 3:23-24
