

FISH // Worldview Club

FISH Club Worldview Outreach is a great way to organize Christian students, from many different churches, in an effort to own what they believe and reach their campus for Christ. Every week has something you're trying to accomplish and every week points toward week four which is designed to be an outreach vehicle to engage nonbelievers in a spiritual conversation about the Gospel & life's most important questions. It's a great way to get the truth of who Jesus is onto your school campus!

Week #1

FOCUS: Students hold each other accountable for what they're learning at church, what God is doing in their life, their daily lifestyles and who they intend to pray for that month.

<u>Student-led welcome and opening prayer</u>	3 minutes
<u>Student-led testimony</u> (basically give example of group time).....	5 minutes
<u>Focus Group Time</u>	18 minutes
- Students will get into groups of three or four and discuss:	
1) What am I applying to my life that I learned at church?	
2) For whom am I praying that God would give me an opportunity to influence for Him?	
- <u>Distribute FISH prayer cards</u> to put on places that are visible to students during the day: [locker, mirror, etc as a reminder to pray for specific lost people]	
<u>Student-led closing prayer</u>	2 minutes

Week #2

INSPIRATION: A guest speaker, either an adult or student, is asked to remind the group that if they will walk with God and pray for their lost friends, God will use them to impact their campus for Christ

<u>Student-led welcome and opening prayer</u>	3 minutes
<u>Guest Speaker Introduction</u>	2 minutes
<u>Guest Speaker</u>	20 minutes
- This could include ministers, students, athletes, parents, business people, school faculty, etc.	
- The speaker should not discuss denominational issues.	
- Make sure the guest speaker has a <u>host that will get them to the meeting room and send a thank you card</u> to the speaker once the meeting is over. The <u>host should call the guest speaker the day before the club meeting, as a reminder to ask them if they intend to share the gospel</u> . If the speaker intends to share the gospel, leave five minutes at the end of the club meeting to complete <u>response cards</u> .	
<u>Student-led closing prayer</u>	2 minutes

Week #3

SHARE: Students or adults previously enlisted and equipped will talk about how they share the gospel and how they would answer the question for next week's worldview outreach.

Student-led welcome and opening prayer.....3 minutes
Speaker shares how to explain the Gospel (GOODNEWS).....8 minutes
Speaker shares how to answer next weeks Worldview Question.....10 minutes
Small group discussion on sharing the Gospel and Worldview Question5 minutes
In groups plan and pray for people to invite to the Worldview Event next week.....3 minutes

Week #4

HOOK: This separate and neutral club meeting is designed to be an outreach vehicle to engage nonbelievers in a spiritual conversation about life's most important questions.

*Posters (skopos.org/evangelism/fish), announcements, social media efforts, etc should be made to publicize the question to be discussed, date, time, and location of the event. Enlist a youth pastor/adult to provide food, drinks, etc. Make sure it's in a separate location a part from the rest of the FISH club meetings. A local youth pastor/adult leader should be present and equipped to moderate a conversation about what people in the room believe about the question posed. Christian students should be prepared to admire their fellow student's views and respectfully share biblical and logical answers to the question along with their testimony to how their relationship with Christ has shaped their worldview and changed their life. Break up in to small groups at the end for discussion questions that lead to an opportunity for students to hear the gospel and put their trust in Jesus!

Food, Friendship Building (All students should sign in to have record of attendance)8 minutes
Student-led welcome and opening.....2 minutes
Moderator asks the group the question and asks for respectful responses.....10 minutes
Small groups discuss questions that lead to the gospel and opportunity to respond.....8 minutes
- Follow up with a FISH leader to record names of seeker students and/or decisions
Student expresses appreciation for attendance and makes announcements.....2 minutes

Week #5 (if applicable)

Planning: During months with a 5th meeting opportunity use it for your whole club to help evaluate and plan future FISH club cycles.

Student-led welcome and opening prayer..... 3 minutes
Discuss wins and ways to improve the different weeks (Take Notes).....8 minutes
Enlist volunteers for future FISH cycles. See underlined positions. (Take Notes).....15 minutes
Student-led closing prayer.....2 minutes
